**Sergeant-at-Arms**

Sergeant *Leon Quinn* was back on the job with another "engineer joke" that was slightly better than his previous effort. Footy winners were fined. The Queen's diamond jubilee gave rise to a number of fines for both Monarchists and Republicans.

**Guest Speakers Kendra Parker and Perry Kick – "Mentone Park Primary School"**

Chairman Maureen McDonald introduced the speakers referring to the links that had been developed between the school and our club over a number of years. The school has been involved in fundraising for Wheel Chairs for Kids and Operation Cleft. Club members have assisted with reading and Len Dawson is involved in the art group.

Kendra is the principal and Perry is the vice-principal of the school. The main thrust of their presentation was to explain major shifts in education in the 21<sup>st</sup> century particularly the way that electronic devices are now being introduced in all areas replacing traditional books, writing, learning by rote and blackboards. Because most primary students spend much time at home using electronic devices, it is essential that all teachers must adapt to the shifts, and keep up to date with the technology, if they are to retain the interest of students.

The core framework of 21<sup>st</sup> century teaching is built around the following points:

- *Core Subjects* (English, reading or language arts, World languages, Arts, Mathematics, Economics, Science, Geography, History, Government and Civics)

- *21st Century Themes* (Global awareness, Financial, economic, business and entrepreneurial literacy, Civic literacy, Health literacy)

- *Learning and Innovation Skills* (Creativity and Innovation Skills, Critical Thinking and Problem Solving Skills, Communication and Collaboration Skills)

- *Information, Media and Technology Skills* (Information Literacy, Media Literacy, ICT Literacy)

- *Life and Career Skills* (Flexibility & Adaptability, Initiative & Self---Direction, Social & Cross-Cultural Skills, Productivity & Accountability, Leadership & Responsibility)

This core framework is based around the following perceived requirements of informed citizens in the 21<sup>st</sup> century:

Guest speakers (cont)

Caring, resilient, problem solvers, communicators, collaborators, researchers / inquirers, thinkers, global citizens, community builders, leaders of a sustainable world, technology savvy.

In addition to achieving proficiency in literacy and numeracy, students are encouraged to develop broader life skills including positive behaviour and attitudes.

In response to questions, Kendra said that the school is relatively small with 265 students. All students have access to computers and other electronic devices at home and at school.
