Sergeant-at-Arms

Keith Carpenter was sergeant for the night and soon settled into his familiar routine. Following on from last week, "no-shows" at the club forum were fined as were footy winners, as well as St Kilda and Richmond supporters for their teams' off-field performances. Golfers, cycling enthusiasts and chocolate lovers all contributed.

Guest Speaker – Ken James "An Actor's Life"

Chairman *Catherine* introduced *Ken James* who is best known for his role as 'Mark Hammond' in the long running television show *Skippy* in the 1960s. He also played 'Tony Wild' in *The Box*, 'Tom' in *Glenview High*, air traffic controller 'Simon Young' in *Skyways* and later 'Mike O'Brien' in *Sons and Daughter*.

Ken was also a TV Chef for 10 years and has appeared in many other television, film and radio shows, live musicals and theatre shows.

Ken was born in Sydney in 1948 and came from a solid working class background. He enjoyed school and took part in school plays. In the early days of television, the industry was looking for child actors and, at age 12, he was introduced to a TV agency and obtained roles in commercials. His parents wanted him to improve and were very supportive of his acting efforts. He can recall his father taking him to studios and waiting around for many hours during rehearsals. At this time he learnt the importance of discipline such as punctuality and knowing ones lines thoroughly.

At age 16 he auditioned for the part in *Skippy* and also won a scholarship to NIDA. After four days at NIDA, Channel 9 offered him the part in *Skippy*, which he took and went on to play in 96 episodes over 3½ years.

His next series was *Barrier Reef* and he lived on Hayman island for a year, including his 21st birthday. Other shows followed including *The Group*, *No 96* and *The Box*. During 13 weeks in the latter show, he commuted weekly between Sydney and Melbourne. At this stage he decided to relocate to Melbourne with his young family and has lived here ever since.

In his career, Ken has met a few people he describes as "crazy" as well as many other very interesting ones. The latter included Frank Thring, Prince Charles, former NSW premier Neville Wran and wife Jill and Hector Crawford. Hector Crawford was responsible for Ken working in Melbourne and had a habit of calling every man as "dear boy" or "fella".

In recent times, Ken has had a cancer scare and, after treatment, has recovered and is still in work. He encourages everyone to seek early diagnosis if they suspect they have a problem.

In response to a number of questions, Ken said that two of his favourite actors were Errol Flynn and David Niven. He had played enjoyable roles in many shows and his favourites included *The Rocky Horror Show* and the musical *Anything Goes*. He has developed a range of voice intonations and accents to suit his various roles.

Skippy still remains his most famous role and it still appears regularly on television around the world.

Cliff Riley proposed the thanks for a great presentation.

The Rotary Four-Way-Test

From the earliest days of the organisation, Rotarians have been concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely quoted statements of business ethics is The Four-Way Test, created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor (who later served as RI president) when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy.

This 24-word test for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for all staff relations with dealers and customers. The survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The Four-Way Test has been translated into more than a hundred languages and published in thousands of ways. It asks the following four questions:

1. **Is it the TRUTH?**
2. **Is it FAIR to all concerned?**
3. **Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?**
4. **Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"**
