The money raised from the Moonshadow performance will be going to one of our favourite charities, Wheel Chairs for Kids.

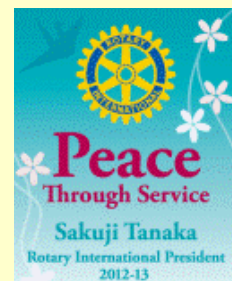

Sergeant *Jack Cooper* was back on the job. Footy winners were very few since most of our members' teams lost. Jack's "chocolate" quiz proved a bit testing for most people except Tim who can be called the "chocolate champion". Guest Speakers – Anthony McNeil and Jack Pyziakos

1 Anthony McNeil

Anthony was introduced by Chairman David who first met him eight years ago at Parkdale Cricket Club. He was sponsored by the club to attend the six-day Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) seminar earlier this month. Anthony is 18 years old and was educated at St Bedes College. He is currently in the first year of a Bachelor of Sports Development course at Deakin University.

Anthony was one of the youngest of the 40 participants, none of whom he knew beforehand. They all settled in well together and by the first day he knew many and made some firm friends. He found the course well designed and presented and covered many aspects of leadership. The main thrust of the program is to encourage participants to become better people.

Anthony found the informal discussion sessions of great benefit as participants opened up and willingly shared ideas. Some of the main messages that he took away were to "have no regrets" about life and to be continually challenging oneself. Another important leadership feature was the ability to respond and handle different people, e.g. extroverts and introverts.

After the seminar, Anthony looks forward to continuing his involvement with Rotary through Rotaract. He also hopes to become a discussion leader at next year's RYLA.

2 Jack Pyziakos

Jack reported on the 2012 Rotary International Convention held early in May that he attended with Kathy.

This was the second such convention that Jack had attended, the first being in New Orleans in 2011. In comparison with New Orleans, Jack felt that a number of aspects of the Bangkok convention were lacking. It appeared that the planning was based on 25,000 attendees whereas over 30,000 turned up and this put a great strain on facilities. Travel by bus around the congested Bangkok streets was slow, the House of Friendship was disappointing and there were other organisational problems.

On the credit side, Jack heard some inspiring addresses, one by a young Australian, Hugh Evans, who founded the Oak Tree Foundation a youth-run aid and development agency with more than 250 volunteers aged under 25 that works in poor countries. Past RI President Kalyan Banerjee was most impressive. The latest update on polio eradication confirms that India is now virtually polio free and there are only three countries where polio is still endemic, viz. Afghanistan, Nigeria and Pakistan.

Jack Pyziakos cont.

Jack also attended two breakout sessions that he found good. One of these was about the Four-Way-Test. The attendance was low and Jack took over as discussion leader. Another session was on Alzheimer's Disease and they learnt of a potential treatment likely to be available five years to halt progress of the disease.

The next Convention will be held from 23 to 26 June 2013 in Lisbon, Portugal. Jack and Kathy have already signed up.
