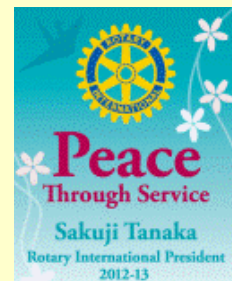

Don Holderness

Don's funeral will be held at Rosebud on Tuesday 28 August commencing at 2.00 pm. It will take place at Rosebud funeral Parlour, Corner Jetty Road and Woonton Road, Rosebud. (Melways 170 F3)

Speaker: Stuart Bryce "Shaggy Ridge – 70 years on"

Stuart Bryce was born in England of Scottish parents and came to live in Australia as a child. After schooling in Tasmania, he had a 30 year career in the RAAF and as a pilot rose to the level of Wing Commander.

He purchased Provence Vineyards near Launceston in 1980, has a bachelor degree in wine source and is vice-president of the Wine Federation. Stuart is also very active in the Life Education movement and other community organisations.

During his air force career, Stuart had flown over PNG and wondered how anyone could manage to travel by foot or vehicle over the very steep terrain. He subsequently met a son of a member of the 2/10th Battalion, 7th Division of the Australian Army in World War 2 who fought and defeated the Japanese army in the battle of Shaggy Ridge in late 1943 and early 1944. This battle became the beginning of the end for the Japanese in PNG and proved decisive in ousting them from the country.

Stuart became interested in the story of Shaggy Ridge and travelled to the site as member of a small party including his daughter, a current member of the Australian army. He illustrated his talk with photographs taken during his tour that showed the magnificent mountain country that is very difficult to walk through. The name Shaggy Ridge is derived from a nickname for an Australian officer of rather unkempt appearance.

The Australian unit was lead by Major George (Bloody) Vasey, a very good and blunt speaking leader who died in an air crash near the end of the war.

The battle was very fierce and brutal over two months. The Australians lost 47 killed while the Japanese lost over 1000 troops. The conditions were so harsh and the fighting so fierce that it had severe psychological effects on the survivors and Stuart illustrated this with an interview and reports with those who had taken part.

The area is well off the regular tourist trail, in very harsh and lightly inhabited terrain so that much of the debris of the battle is still visible. Because of the steep, precipitous terrain, Stuart's party found it extremely difficult and dangerous to move around. Obviously conditions would be worse with an enemy shooting at you. The difficult conditions also meant that it was necessary to deliver rations to the troops by air drop and these did not always land in the right place. Artillery support proved vital in clearing the enemy from well entrenched positions.

After losing the battle, the Japanese army was in full retreat and many atrocities occurred in this time.

After Stuart replied to a number of questions from the floor, *David Brunt* proposed the vote of thanks for a very descriptive and informative address.
