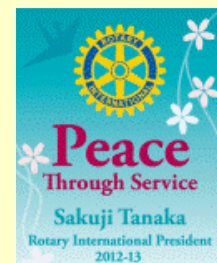

Director and member announcements

Treasurer *Malcolm Finlayson* advised that following this month's board meeting, payments of annual contribution to The Rotary Foundation have been made - \$4,500 to Annual Giving and \$500 to Polio Eradication.

Leon Quinn (vocational) advised that a visit is now booked to the Monash synchrotron for Sunday 14 October commencing at 1 pm. Leon has 30 tickets available. Leon also reminded of a committee meeting to be held that evening.

Brian Foley (international) advised that the board had agreed to three international projects:

- Participation in a Foundation matching grant application to install water purification systems at schools in Shaanxi Province China. This involves 12 clubs in District 9810 and Mordialloc is the lead club. Our proposed contribution is \$3,000
- Establishment of an art and craft training at an orphanage in Tibet at a cost of \$3,500 over two years.
- Contribution of \$1,000 to provide aquaboxes for flood relief in The Philippines.

Bob Travers (new generations) reminded of two coming events at local schools, viz.,

- Morning tea at Mentone Primary School on Wednesday 17 October. An invitation has been emailed to members.
- A fund raising event for Wheel Chairs for Kids will be held on Friday 2 November at Mentone Grammar School. Our club is to run a barbeque on the day.

Bob also said that Bendigo Bank is likely to renew funding to maintain the police beach buggy for another three years.

Clem Quick announced that a profit of \$575 resulted from the recent Bunnings sausage sizzle. The next sausage sizzle at Bunnings will be on Monday 22 October. No other dates are scheduled yet.
