Thank you all very much for the beautiful box of flowers and card of good wishes which Glenyse and Jack brought to me in hospital.

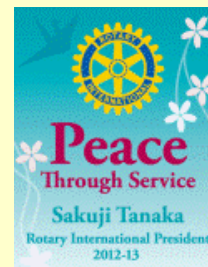
My new knee and I are slowly learning to manage together. I feel very encouraged by your kind wishes.

Guest Speaker: Carol Quayle

Carol gave a very comprehensive, illustrated presentation covering her life history. She was born in McKinnon and grew up in Highett where her family were deeply involved in local community activities, including scouts and guides, tennis and other sports. Carol was a girl guide

Carol did her secondary schooling at Moorabbin High School and remembers a saying of a valued teacher that "determination will get you through" that she still follows closely

Carol Quayle (cont)

At the end of schooling Carol decided to follow a career in the health industry and trained as a general nurse at Austin Hospital followed by specialised training at Princess Margaret Hospital for Children (WA) and Mercy Maternity Hospital for midwifery.

Carol and Don married in 1981. They had four children, a son Lachlan who died at 2 years of age and three daughters Bronwyn, Rhiannon and Megan who are now adults with good careers. Since the loss of their son in infancy, Carol and the family have had a special relationship with the Sudden Infant Death Syndrome organisation. The family is close knit and they also are "dog people" with a series of pets over the years.

Following time off raising her young family, Carol returned to nursing in 1991 and Don became the "house husband" a role that he has undertaken for 21 years.

A broken wrist suffered in 1992 meant that Carol could not continue in nursing and lead to a career change into social work. She undertook further studies that lead to a Bachelor's degree and later a Master's in social work.

Her work as a social worker involved:

- ▶ Outreach
- ▶ Parenting challenges
- ▶ Postnatal depression
- ▶ Adolescent transition challenges
- ▶ Providing opportunities for socially disadvantaged families

Carol then moved on to Royal Children's Hospital – the Victorian Paediatric Palliative Care. This brought in a range of new challenges such as support for families with a child facing death and education at all levels of the medical community.

She then took a position managing a team in palliative care, using her nursing and social work skills advocating for societal change and challenges to current medical practice in dying and death.

Carol has now returned to social work at in a hospital setting at Dandenong. She now faces a diversity of new challenges such as different cultures and languages, aboriginal health, health diagnosis (maternity to geriatrics to disability), age issues, multidisciplinary teams, settings (community/hospital/home/inpatient & outpatient) and others.

Her move to work in Dandenong means that she can continue her professional passions while devoting more time to family, Rotary community activities and her interest in Vietnam.

Carol concluded by saying that, having a house husband, there are some things that she will not do including cooking, cleaning, mowing lawns and putting the rubbish out.

Brian Foley proposed the thanks.
