Sergeant-at-Arms

Following on from the theme of the previous week, ladies who do not mow lawns were fined. Bike riders are in the news and Tim paid up. Keith keeps an eye on the footy draft and continued the quiz series – but not with chocolate frogs as prizes.

Guest Speakers: Caroline and Frank – Alcoholics Anonymous

The speakers, Caroline and Frank (first names only are used in AA) gave a very blunt and somewhat confronting account of their personal problems with alcohol, the effects on their lives and families, the steps they have taken and the assistance through Alcoholics Anonymous to re-establish themselves.

Caroline is a young woman who claims to have been sober now for $4\frac{1}{2}$ years. She realised that her life was in a mess and travelled to India where she discovered Alcoholics Anonymous (AA). It can be described as a fellowship group where people meet voluntarily to share experiences and be supportive of each other in attempting to overcome alcohol problems.

Frank, a middle aged man originally from Scotland, has been sober for 20 years and was introduced to AA through a detoxication program. AA operates in many countries. He quoted the case of the North American Indians, who were nearly wiped out as a race 200 years ago and now have one of the most effective AA programs. Frank was introduced to AA by another recovering alcoholic and now attends meetings as often as he can, even daily. A guiding principle is that recovering alcoholics cannot go back to being "social drinkers" and must continue supporting each other. Frank admitted to coming from a family of alcoholics and was not accepted well when he returned to Scotland to try to re-establish family bonds after being sober for 2½ years.

Frank also said that of the Australian population of 22 million, 8% are considered to be addicted to alcohol and some 18,000 are recovering. There are strong links between crime statistics and alcohol addiction. The Government raises some \$6 billion in excise taxes on alcohol and only a small proportion goes to rehabilitation programs. Detoxication programs are expensive.

Caroline and Frank responded to a number of questions covering aspects of how AA works.

Cliff Riley proposed the thanks for the very personal and explicit presentations.
