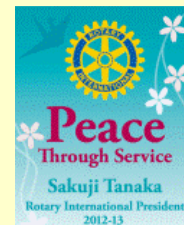

President announcements

President Glenyse Guinan opened the meeting and announced the following:

- Glenyse has now officially retired from her position as volunteer coordinator with the Salvation Army
- Earlier in the day, a number of club members had attended and assisted with the barbeque for the Christmas Lunch at the Kinston Gardens Centre at Dingley Village
- Len Dawson has prepared a stock of Christmas cards that members can purchase for \$1 (including envelope). Funds raised will go to club projects.

Director and member announcements

Secretary *Brian Schauer* has received a letter of appreciation from RC Aspendale for our involvement in the Camp Awakenings program

Brian Foley (international) has received a letter of thanks from RC Eltham for our donation of \$1000 to Aquaboxes. This will provide two boxes of water purification equipment for use after major floods and other disasters in South East Asia.

Carol Quayle (community) attended a recent meeting of the district indigenous support committee. Carol commented that it was enlightening to see the range of programs available for indigenous people in our own community.

Rob Goode (program) is preparing the speaker program for the next six months and would welcome suggestions from members. Please advise Rob if you know of a potential speaker and their topic.

Len Dawson advised that Mentone Grammar School has collected 300 presents from a gift tree for distribution to needy persons through our club. These are to be collected this Monday (10/12) for delivery to a Berry Street depot in Clayton.

Kay Gordon suggested that we might like to donate to deserving families in the Mentone area. Kay also advised that Chris Chant, the principal of Mentone Primary School, with whom we have had a good relationship, is moving to another school in 2013.

John Fowler (fellowship) announced details and distributed an attendance list for the Christmas Dinner at Woodlands Golf Club on 18 December. The cost is \$55 per head.

John also reminded about the social and sports night at Sandringham Croquet Club on Wednesday 9 January.

John said that Le Pine Funerals are collecting Christmas gifts for distribution to needy persons. The main need is gifts for young people aged 14 to 16 and suitable gifts can be left at any Le Pine office.

David Wright and *Maureen McDonald* had attended the second meeting of the proposed Kingston Rotaract Club. At present they are meeting fortnightly and endeavouring to attract interested young people.

Sergeant-at-Arms

Sergeant *Jack Cooper* commenced the fines session with Australian supporters for the cricket team's poor performance. Our Adelaide Crows supporter, John H had to pay for that club's shonky trade deal. Glenyse has now officially retired (more time for Rotary?) and promptly forgot to wear her president's collar. Jack then conducted his popular quiz with chocolate frogs back as prizes.

Guest Speaker – Len Dawson – The Gnome Festival

Len used a PowerPoint presentation outlining the main features of the Gnome Festival and a range of issues concerning the running of the event. In his introduction, Len pointed out that the event is designed to raise the profile of Rotary in the local community with emphasis on families. We have obtained a prime location, the Peter Scullin Reserve, on one of the busiest community days of the year and have strong support of the Kingston City Council.

The main points are summarised below:

Amusements will include a bouncy castle, animal farm, face painting, mini golf and gnome painting (plaster gnome painting and coloured in drawings)

Food and drink facilities will include an all day BBQ, a fairy floss stall, snow cones, popcorn and soft drinks. All these will be run by the club. City of Kingston is to pay for 250 free breakfasts

Stall Holders and Exhibitors arranged to date include a book stall (Rotary), RC Dingley Village jewellery sales, gnomes for sale, Rotary information, Disaster Aid display, Parkdale Secondary College, Mordialloc Sporting Club and others.

Gnome festival (cont)

Other activities include all day music supplied by the Southern Area Concert Band.

Detailed infrastructure arrangements are required for the Peter Scullin Reserve, various marquees, amusement facilities, food and drink stalls, fencing, electric power and site allocation

Sponsors arranged to date include The Good Guys, Westfield Southland, City of Kingston, Thomson Real Estate, Woolworths, Frucor supplying drinking water, Vic Egg Board and Mordialloc Sporting Club

In addition, we have received a cricket bat signed by the Australian test team and a football signed by St Kilda players. These are to be raffled on the day.

Promotional activity already undertaken or planned includes posters and flyers sent to schools, use of social media, media releases, Rotary district newsletters, publicity to other Rotary clubs and local community radio. The main media publicity will take place in January in the lead up to the event.

Health and safety issues being addressed cover first aid presence, hi visibility vests for all staff, prepaid tickets for most activities to reduce cash handling, arrangements for secure off site money storage and a police presence is being arranged.

Len is seeking commitment from as many members as possible to assist on the day and in the lead up days. A number of members have already volunteered and others are requested to advise Len of availability.

Members were then invited to offer comments and suggestions and these are summarised as follows:

- The festival will run from 10.00 am to 4.00 pm on 26 January. Setting up of stalls will be from 8.00 am.
- Some additional stalls can be accommodated. Please advise any ideas.
- The cricket bat and football raffles should be promoted through local cricket clubs.
- Extreme weather conditions (high temperatures or severe storms) could lead to cancellation and inevitable costs. Jeff Needham is monitoring overall finances and undertaking a risk management assessment. Food costs would be the biggest loss although this could be minimised as Woolworths are to supply meat and other items "as required"
- The costs of the animal farm will be covered by the Thomson Real Estate sponsorship.
- Queries were raised about the fairy floss stall although this is popular for young children
- Other food stalls suggested include mini pavlovas
- Car parking will be very limited and it will be difficult to reserve any places

John Fowler expressed congratulations to Len and all the committee for all their work and explanation

In closing the session and thanking Len, Chairman Cliff emphasised that this event deserves support of all club members to be truly successful.

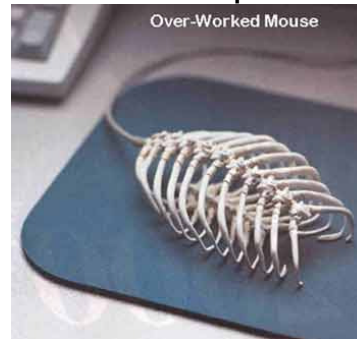
Book Stall at Gnome Festival

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.
