#### President's announcements

President *Glenyse Guinan* opened the meeting and announced the following:

- She had received a message from Kay Gordon. Her son's wedding in Ireland went well and she is now having a good time travelling in Europe.
- An invitation has been received from the Mentone RSL sub-branch for club members to attend the annual Anzac Day ceremony commencing 8.40 am

As the meeting was a club forum, *Glenyse* chaired the whole meeting

#### Sergeant-at-Arms

Sergeant Jack Cooper started with Jack P and Mike W who were late. Paul Taranto had a birthday and winning footy supporters paid up. In an attempted sleight of hand, President Glenyse and Sergeant Jack were noticed exchanging their chains of office.

Jack again conducted the weekly quiz covering geography, history, people, news topics and general knowledge and distributed chocolate frogs to the winners

### Club Forum

The regular director and member announcements formed part of the general forum agenda for the night.

Treasurer *Malcolm Finlayson* had distributed a full set of accounts to all members by email before the meeting. There were no questions on this report at the meeting and Malcolm asked that any matters requiring clarification be sent to him.

- David Brunt advised that he had been asked to head the vocational committee next year and would be looking for ideas for suitable projects or activities. One suggestion by David is for the club to offer Vocational Service Awards to local businesses in areas such as:
- Pride of workmanship
- Vocational excellence
- Youth leadership Excellence in community service

Next year's committee is yet to be formed

President *Glenyse* raised the matter of the range and quality of meals provided at club meetings. It was agreed that two courses should include soup and main course for the winter months and main course and dessert for the warmer months. Helen from the Sporting Club offered to come up with a wider range of choices for the main courses with the menu rotating over about a six-week period.

*Brian Foley* (International) provided a progress summary of international projects for the year:

- Continuation of our association with RC Austen Oak Hill, USA who funded the Koorie Mob surf carnival and will be contributing to a project for children at Monash Hospital
- Matching grant project to install water purification units at six schools in China
- Participating in a water and sanitation project in Moradabad city, Uttar Pradesh, India,
- Contributing to the East Timor Children's Family Home in Dili to provide housing and assistance for young girls at serious risk of abuse.
- Support for the Paddy's Jewel school for hearing impaired children in Vietnam
- Supporting the Tibetan Village project
- Interplast through the golf day on 10 May
- Donations to Rotary Foundation annual giving and the polio appeal
- A number of projects are under consideration

*Carol Quayle* (community) listed the following projects in various stages of development

- A proposal to purchase a community bus
- Continuing support for the Bay Group
- Further improvements at Parkdale Railway Station
- "Entertainment Books". The club will have about 50 to sell and these will be available shortly.
- The "Fair Share" food bank is under consideration
- The "Walk for Remembrance" conducted by SIDS was successful in 2012 and we expect to support it again in 2013. Likely date is Sunday 20 October
- A further project with the Kingston Koorie Mob
- Other activities include a simplified grant to assist Monash Hospital, a project related to domestic violence and distribution of Christmas gifts,

There was no New Generations presentation in the absence of Bob Travers. However Max Crimmins reported on the regular reading classes that he and Don Butler had been assisting with at Mordialloc Primary School. He said that he enjoyed the experience and was impressed by the efforts of the teachers. He understood that those who helped with the reading at Mentone Primary had similar experience.

*Clem Quick* advised that the next Bunnings sausage sizzles would be held on Friday 3 May and Saturday 3 August. At this stage, roster arrangements seem satisfactory.

John Fowler (Fundraising - Fellowship) spoke of the great work that Evan Johnson had carried out to get the club footy tipping competition up and running. It had been hoped that greater numbers would have entered. A club fellowship dinner at a restaurant will be announced shortly.

*Len Dawson* (Marketing) brought along six signs advertising the club, two each to be erected at Mordialloc, Parkdale and Mentone Railway Stations. Len also has been looking at club uniforms, in company with President Glenyse, to improve club image at public events. A sketch showing styles and prices for club T shirts, rugby tops, jackets and caps is at the back of this bulletin.

Len also said that the Gnome festival committee is looking at suitable dates for the 2014 event. This year's event was held on 26 January (Australia Day) and many members are keen to keep to that day. However, there is a difficulty with that date when the schools have not resumed after New Year. The committee is considering a possible alternative date of Sunday 3 March and will report to the board shortly with a recommendation.

Jeff Needham (Art Show) advised that the dates for the 2013 art show are now set for 17 to 22 September. The committee is currently updating the artist list and looking for potential sponsors and these will be negotiated through the marketing committee

Jeff is about to coordinate the next update of the club's strategic plan. All committee chairmen are requested to submit plans for next year to Jeff by 1 May.

*Russ Hellier* reported that arrangements for the Interplast Golf Day on Friday 10 May are all in place. Barry Donaldson has done most of the work already. Entry will be \$65 per player. 80 to 100 players are expected.

*Brian Schauer* pointed out that the RI and District 9810 websites provide a large resource base for committee chairmen seeking ideas for their portfolios.

*Cliff Riley* raised the issue of project funding and asked if funds allocated by the board are fully expended. Other members also commented on spending priorities. Treasurer Malcolm explained that some committees did underspend because projects reports had not been developed and submitted for board approval. Brian Foley and Jeff Needham both pointed out that the club strategic planning process is an appropriate way of setting club projects and priorities. After that it is up to the committees to get projects up and running.

Clem Quick raised two matters of concern to him, viz,

- The low standard of gifts for guest speakers
- The poor meeting attendance by a number of members.

*John Hoffmann* commented on the poor quality of the sound system in the meeting room and asked that something be done about replacing it.

*Brian Foley* said that he was looking for a deputy as club webmaster and bulletin editor with a view to that person taking over these roles in the near future.

In conclusion, President Glenyse thanked everyone for their contributions. She also referred to the comprehensive list of club projects and achievements that is now listed on the club website. The web link is:

### Rotary Attendance Requirements – What are they?

All Rotarians are encouraged to attend their club regularly and participate in service activities. The basic attendance requirements are:

Attendance Percentage

- (1) To attend or make-up for at least 50% of regular club meetings in each half of the year;
- (2) To attend 30% of the club's regular meetings in each half of the year.

#### **Consecutive Absences**

Unless excused by the club board, if a member fails to attend, or make-up, four consecutive regular club meetings such non-attendance may be considered as a request for termination.

#### Make-ups

Make-ups can be made within 14 days before or after the scheduled club meeting in many ways:

- (1) Attending the regular meeting of another club
- (2) Attending a regular meeting of a Rotaract or Interact club, a Rotary Fellowship or Rotary Community Corps
- (3) Attending a Rotary Convention, Assembly, Zone Institute, a district conference, district assembly, a district committee and other defined meetings
- (4) Attending a club service project or community project authorised by the board
- (5) Attending a meeting of the club board meeting or a service committee
- (6) Participating for at least 30 minutes in an interactive club website meeting (a Rotary E-Club).

#### Excused absences

Members can be excused from attendance as follows:

- (1) Where Leave of Absence is granted by the board. This cannot be for a period longer than 12 months.
- (2) Under the "85 year" rule. If the age of a member is 65 and above and the member's age in years <u>plus</u> years of Rotary service total 85, the member can apply to the board for exemption
- (3) Current RI officers (i.e. governors) are exempt from the attendance requirement in their own clubs.

Further details are available from the secretary and in the RI Manual of Procedure.
