Guest Speaker – Kay Gordon "Travels in Ireland, Europe and Egypt"

Kay told us of her recent trip combining participating in her son Cameron's wedding in Ireland with a holiday in parts of Ireland, Spain, Germany, France and Egypt. Kay showed a representative range of photos showing the various places and events that she saw.

The trip started when Kay and a friend Ces stopped over in Dubai for 48 hours, seeing the modern wonder that is Dubai including a man-made snowfield in Dubai and a trip out into the nearby sandy desert.

Arrival in Ireland coincided with cold weather, the temperature remaining between 3°C and 6°C throughout their stay. The sights of Ireland included Dublin Castle, Trinity college and the Book of Kells, travel around the Ring of Kerry, Bunratty Castle, Galway and Newgrange Sloane – an ancient Celtic burial mound.

Wedding Day for Cameron and Eimear produced a heavy snow cover but did little to upset the happy event.

After Ireland, Kay travelled on to Stuttgart in Germany, a very "clinical" and ordered city, to visit friends. Then on to Paris where they say the sights via a "hop on and hop off" bus. Kay was surprised at the number of beggars seen around Paris. Next stop was Barcelona in Spain where they saw many the magnificent buildings built for the 1992 Olympics, Gaudi's as yet unfinished cathedral and Montserrat and they were fascinated to meet the "man without a head".

The last stop was Egypt that Kay visited with son Rohan, Hannah and grandson Callum. The temperature in Egypt was mostly a pleasant 20° to 30°. The dire economic problems of Egypt due to continuing unrest were apparent with the general run down state of Cairo and a lack of tourists with many facilities and cruise boats not operating. Despite some fine old buildings in Cairo, there were many unfinished ones.

Despite the tour brochure pre-publicity, Kay found that they were restricted to a compound at their hotel for security and could only venture out in a supervised group. However, they were able to see many of the sights including the Nile River, Pyramids, the Sphinx, the Colossus of Ramses II, Lake Nasser formed by the Aswan Dam, the temple of Abu Simbel that was raised and rebuilt 60 metres higher to avoid flooding from Lake Nasser, Luxor and many other temples and sights along the Nile. They also visited the hotel on the Nile that was frequented by Agatha Christie and Winston Churchill.

Brian Foley proposed the thanks for Kay's very informative and enjoyable presentation.

Speaker on 4 June on subject of Bipolar Disorder.

Our speaker on 4 June will be Michael Reynolds a researcher into Bipolar Disorder who has sent the following information about his presentation. Any family or friends would be welcome to attend this presentation.

"To whom it may concern,

I am writing to you today as a Monash Rotaract member of District 9810 and as a researcher in Bipolar Disorder and genetics. Our particular interest is in identifying endophenotypes, the expression of neurocognitive and social cognitive enhancements or deficits, which will aid in identifying specific genes. Identifying genes will greatly aid in creating novel treatment for those people suffering bipolar disorder, both immediately as techniques for psychotherapy may be developed and long-term as new genetic markers will lead to novel pharmacotherapy options.

In association with Swinburne University, Monash University and the Alfred Hospital, we have particular interest in this gap in the literature, which we intend to address with this project. These benefits for treatment in Bipolar Disorder will aid in improving functional, occupational, social interactions and daily living.

We would like to recruit First Degree relatives (e.g. siblings or offspring) of those people suffering bipolar disorder but do not have the disorder themselves. Participation involves completing an array of cognitive and emotional tasks in addition to a survey and an interview. We also require a blood sample for genetic analysis. The cognitive battery includes testing your executive functioning abilities, attention, working memory and more. Everything is confidential and participation is voluntary. You will also be paid \$50 for your time once you have completed the interview, cognitive battery, survey, and provided a genetic sample.
