David Brunt was the Chairman for the evening.

David welcomed all Club members, visiting Rotarians, partners and guests to the meeting.

No regular Rotary business announcements were made.

Musical entertainment was provided by Paul Allwright.

We enjoyed a fine three-course dinner provided by the courteous and efficient staff of Woodlands Golf Club.

Paul and Dianne Taranto organised the changeover night raffle with 7 great prizes. The raffle raised \$150.

Thanks went to Jack Pyziakos and Kathy Thompson for the donation of a cyclamen plant for each table. Jack thanked Brenda Sagar for the beautiful presentation. The plants were auctioned and raised \$120.

Jack Cooper proposed the toasts and welcomed Russell Gurney, District Governor for 2018-19, and his wife Shelley.

Russell addressed the meeting and spoke of the internationality of rotary, highlighted in his recent visit to San Diego where he met with 536 other governors from 180 or so countries, all united behind the rotary badge.

He also stressed the importance of getting Rotoract more involved with our clubs and involving them in projects.

Lastly he remarked on Rotary's commitment to eradicate polio and asked what other organisation could have shown that commitment over 30 years.

PP Jack Cooper – Foundation member of the Club and acknowledged for his hard work on many club projects, including among many, the Art Show and the Gnome and Fairy Festival.

President's Annual Report

President Paul then presented the Annual Report for 2017-18 and spoke about the Rotary themes. For the year preceding this one the theme was "Rotary Serving Humanity", the theme for this year is "Make a Difference" and the theme for the coming year is "Be the Inspiration". Paul was proud and pleased to report that the Rotary Club of Mordialloc has continued to serve humanity at a local, national and international level, making a difference in the lives of many individuals and communities and is still standing as an inspiration in the community in which we serve.

The Club was saddened at the passing of its past President and Father of the Gnome and Fairy Festival Len Dawson. The loss of members Kelly Banks and Past President Jeff Needham was also a disappointment. On the other hand the Club gained new members Trina and Ernie Williams both of whom have pitched in and are contributing to the Club's work in a number of areas. Paul also said he was looking forward to our two newest members Kathy Thompson and Dianne Taranto, both of whom have supported Club activities in the past, continuing their engagement with Club projects.

The Club has responded to the recent losses by engaging all members in a review of how the Club operates. Paul thanked all members for their positive involvement in this activity and he is sure the Club will be better for the changes identified.

Looking back now at the achievements of the Club in 2017/2018 Paul highlighted the following: In our local community the Club certainly Made a Difference to:

- Our neighbours who utilize the facilities at the Mordialloc Neighbourhood House with our financing of a new shade sail.
- The Clients who take their weekly lunch and partake in social activities at the Salvation Army Kingston Gardens with the Club contributing to the cost of Barbeques, the Christmas lunch and members helping run activities including Len Dawson's art classes.
- The people in our community who live alone with the provision of a Christmas lunch at Woodlands.
- The people who benefit from the good works of FareShare with the Club financing new equipment both in the FareShare kitchen and the vegetable garden near Moorabbin airport.

The Club certainly made a difference in the lives of many young people including:

- Ally Steele, Sarah Wich and Nicola Brooks all of whom are benefiting from the Rotary international youth exchange program.
- Olivia Jaconelli who attended the *National Youth Science Forum.*
- Samantha Cattermole and Dessi Turk who attended MUNA.
- The students from Doveton College who were involved in the building of the shelter shed financed by the Club.
- The babies that will benefit from the research financed by the SIDs organization from the funds raised at the annual *Walk for Remembrance*.
- The young people who will benefit from the research supported by the *Australian Rotary Health Research Foundation* with funds raised by the Club during the annual mad hat day, the raffle at Bunnings and the weekly club raffle.
- The students who benefit from the reading sessions provided by Club members and friends of the Club. As will the students who benefited from the "Mock Interviews" also provided by Club members and friends of the Club.

In the international sphere the Club continues to make a difference in a number of areas. Those that have benefited include:

- The thirteen individuals that will receive a wheelchair as a result of funds raised by the Club at weekly meetings for Wheelchairs for Kids.
- The more than 800 women that will receive a birthing kit that were put together by our Club and the Cheltenham club.
- The recipients of medical care through Interplast as a result of funds raised through the Club's annual Golf day.
- The future generations that will no longer live with the fear of Polio once it is eradicated through the continued funding from our Club and other Rotary Clubs for Polio Plus.
- The families that will have improved hygiene from the bars of soap supplied through SoapAid with the help of funds raised by our Club through the weekly raffle.
- The citizens of Vietnam that benefit from the exchange of medical knowledge through the team that visited this year with our own Carol Quayle.

Paul thanked all the members of the Club and the friends of the Club that have contributed in any way in 2017/2018. It is through all their efforts that the Club has been able to make a difference.

In particular, Paul thanked soon to be President Jack Pyziakos and all those that assisted with the Bunnings BBQs, which raised \$12,000 for the Club's charity account. Although we were not able to complete the holding of the *Gnome and Fairy Festival* due to inclement weather Paul thanked all on the organizing committee for what was a very well organized event. A special mention went to Ernie Williams for his efforts in obtaining over 40 prizes from local businesses to be used to raise funds.

Paul also pointed out that a Club like ours does not operate without a lot of people doing a lot of work in the background, and thanked members who have assisted with the organization of meetings, taking bulletin notes and other duties.

The Club has benefited again from a wide array of speakers this year: the inside story on Black Caviar; George 'Old King' Cole and his contribution to Melbourne, an Olympic Champion and the story behind Coby the Chimp. Thank you went to Glenyse Cooper for her efforts in arranging the speakers and all the members who have steered speakers Glenyse's way.

Paul also thanked all the Board members and committee Chairs. He remarked that a board does not function well without a good secretary and our Club has been served well by Carol Quayle in this regard. The Club also owes a debt of thanks to Graeme Bruce and Keith Carpenter and their fastidious accounting for the funds collected and spent. Keith is especially in our thoughts and we wish him a speedy recovery.

Paul hoped Club members had been able to enjoy his weekly messages, which he enjoyed writing each week, and he thanked Brian Foley for putting the bulletin together each week. He also said he appreciated the articles that Damien West contributed from time to time.

In closing, Paul repeated something he wrote in his first message:

In his first go around as Club President he said that Mordialloc stood for Many Ordinary Rotarians Doing It All the time Leading, Lending a hand Or Caring. He believes this is still the case. In this year he would like to add the twist that we as individuals, as a Club and as an organization can truly Make a Difference through the Power of One. One person through one action can really make a difference in the world. It may be a small gesture as giving another person a smile or it may be a larger activity as initiating the effort to eradicate polio.

In this year about to close Paul truly believes the Power of One has been demonstrated at many levels by the Club members, the Club and Rotary.

Paul closed with two messages from those he shared this year. The first is: "No one can do everything but everyone can do something". The second is: "If you are looking backwards then you are looking in the wrong direction"

Paul concluded by saying he looks forward to Jack's year and for the Club to continuing to "Be the Inspiration" in 2018/2019, and thanked the Club for the opportunity to be its President.

SECOND. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

The Rotary Four-Way-Test

- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"
