Message from President Jack Pyziakos

It was a great pleasure to have our new Rotary Exchange student Gabrielle De Bonnieres come to the club fellowship dinner at Michelangelo's Restaurant in Aspendale Gardens last Tuesday evening. Gabrielle came with host parents Ann McWilliam and Mike Brooks and met a number of members and partners. Gabrielle has now started school at Kilbreda College, met with her counsellor Jess Taranto and had a walk along the beach with Jess's dog, Gabrielle has a dog at home in France. She will be attending club meetings regularly and I hope all members and partners can get to meet her soon.

Kathy and I attended the annual changeover night for Moorabbin Rotary club last Monday evening. It was interesting to hear about a program called Next Steps Ltd that involves packing and distributing manchester packs for refuges and organisations in ten different metropolitan and rural areas of Victoria. These packs assist families affected by family violence in their transition from refuges to new homes. The presentation was given by Ian Slater, Principal of McDonalds Slater and Lay, a member of Cheltenham Rotary Club.

On Friday night I attended the District 9810 Presidents' Meeting led by Governor Russell Gurney and including Assistant Governor Kathy Monley and presidents from four surrounding clubs.

Some items covered at the meeting included membership, summarising the different donation programs, club giving, EREY (every Rotarian every year) Paul Harris fellows (PHF), Major Donor, Benefactors, Bequest Society membership, and Arch Klumph Society Member, all of which are tax deductible except giving to the endowment fund. An Interact president also gave a speech about the benefits of forming Interact clubs and who was so bubbly and full of enthusiasm when talking about the Interact club she had formed.

Another subject discussed was the desperation of many farmers in rural Australia due to continuing drought and how we may be able to assist through the Bale out Appeal. You may have noticed this matter advertised on television recently with the Public Image Co-ordinator explaining a Rotary Australia partnership with Channel 9 and the National Farmers' Federation. This is a wonderful opportunity to spotlight Rotary and its community involvement.

Unfortunately, the past week saw the passing of another past Mordialloc Rotary club member Russ Hellier, Past President 1993-94, Paul Harris Fellow 1998 and Honorary Member 2016 - a perfect gentleman. Jack Cooper and Russ first met in 1966 when they started the tennis club in Reserve Rd Beaumaris.
