Club Forum

Meeting time

President *Glenyse* opened discussion by asking members if the present club meeting time (6pm for 6.30pm start) is suitable or would a later time suit members, particularly those coming direct from work. After various comments, it was agreed to leave the time as it is.

Structure of Rotary

President *Glenyse* briefly outlined the structure of Rotary and the links between members, clubs, districts and the board of Rotary International. The 34,000 Rotary clubs worldwide have a great degree of autonomy in deciding what projects to undertake and how they conduct their activities as long as they remain within Rotary broad guidelines and procedures.

Art Show

Jeff Needham advised that the meeting scheduled for 7 August (the week prior to the show) will be devoted to detailed discussion of art show administration and procedures. It is important that matters such as receipt of paintings on the first night, payment procedures and security are carried out correctly.

Parking restrictions are enforced at Southland, particularly on the ground level, and members should ensure that they park in appropriate areas to avoid being fined. The rooftop area is generally OK. Rob Goode also pointed out that it is difficult to park his truck near the door for more than a few minutes on the set up night. This will be raised with Southland management.

Gnome Festival – 26 January 2013
Len Dawson gave a progress report on arrangements for the Gnome Festival to be held as part of the Australia Day celebrations at Peter Scullin Reserve Mordialloc. Len brought along two gnomes, "Mordy" and "Maude" mascots for the event.

The day is seen as a major public relations opportunity for the club and has strong backing from Kingston City Council. Among the many attractions planned are a 40 piece brass band, jumping castle, animal farm, Rotary enquiry booth (Kevin Harrison), sausage sizzle and the council has agreed to pay for 250 egg and bacon rolls. Apart from the gnome committee, many other club members have roles or will have on the day.

Strategic and Operational Plan

Jeff Needham gave a general explanation of the planning process that was used for the first time last year. The 2012-13 plan has been prepared as a draft based on information from committee heads. As it now stands total expenditure would be approximately \$50K, greater than likely income. Some further refinement will be carried out and the final adopted plan will be available to members

New club website http://mordiallocrotary.org.au/ Brian Foley gave a demonstration of the new club website that is now operating. It uses modern features and replaces the 10-year old site

The site opens with a photo of Mordialloc Creek, by Len Dawson, that clearly identifies our club. The site has features that are intended to be useful for both Rotarians and the wider community including a calendar, news features, bulletin, details of major project activities, club contact and locality details and links to many other useful sites. There is a password protected section for material that is only relevant to Mordialloc members. Login details are available to members

The site will be developed further and members are encouraged to use it and suggest material for inclusion
