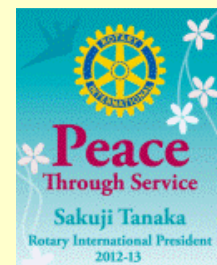
Hope to see you all at the meeting on Tuesday.

President's announcements

President *Glenyse Guinan* opened the meeting and gave the following announcements:

- The final report on the art show should be available this week and is expected to show a profit of around \$9,000
- The next Bunnings sausage sizzle will be on Friday 21 September.
- The next fellowship event will be a High Tea at the Pyziakos home on the afternoon of Sunday 23 September.

Treasurer Malcolm Finlayson gave a summary of present date of club finances as follows:

Brian Foley (International) advised that the international committee had recommended several projects for consideration at the next board meeting. One of these is a water purification project for schools in China involving a Rotary Foundation matching grant with participation by a number of clubs.

Jack Cooper reminded final arrangements for the Kingston Charitable Trust Golf day held last Friday.

Maureen McDonald (New Generations) asked several members and partners involved in the literacy and reading program at local primary schools to speak about their impressions and comment on their experiences:

- *Bob Travers* said that he and Ann attend Mentone Primary School regularly and had established relationships with a number of children whose schooling was affected by troubled home life. It was pleasing to see the positive response once trust and relationship was formed. Bob added that he had assisted the school in obtaining a \$15,000 grant from National Australia Bank for the school to purchase iPads and training in their use.
- *Len Dawson* initially went to Mentone Park primary School to assist with the reading program and has ended up helping to run the art class.
- Max Crimmins and Don Butler both assist with the Years 2 to 5 reading program at Mordialloc Primary School where both attended in the 1930s. Max said they are impressed with the assistance provided by teachers to all the children.
- *Kay Gordon* works with year 4 at Mentone Primary School. Most notable is a young girl from Peru who has been in Australia for five months and now speaks almost perfect English
- *Jean Finlayson* enjoys the experience at Mentone Primary especially working with a young girl from Zimbabwe.

Maureen added that Mentone Grammar school had an event planned for 2 November to assist Wheel Chairs for Kids.

Sergeant-at-Arms

Sergeant *Jack Cooper*, fined supporters of winning football teams. Jeff Needham was seen wearing a tie and it seems he went to the same tie shop as Evan. There was a good response to the Rotary and general knowledge quiz and Helen Goode won most chocolate frogs. Kay and the two Jacks had dollar delights.

Guest Speaker: District Governor Brian Martin and Sue

Brian began his address with comments about "Getting back to Business" as a District theme for 2012-13 intended to give greater focus to the vocational area of service. He is encouraging Rotarians to use their professional skills through Rotary to help less fortunate people. He also seeks to grow Rotary through closer links with business and attract project funds from industry.

Brian Martin continued

The five Victorian Rotary districts have received a Rotary grant to assist improving Rotary's public image. This has funded professionally prepared brochures aimed at promotion through the business community and an article to be published in the RACV magazine. There is a continuing need to grow Rotary to provide ongoing service and this can best be brought about if all Rotarians are in a position to respond positively to the question: "What is Rotary?"

District 9810 is the highest per capita contributor to the Rotary Foundation in Australia (\$199 per head in 2011-12 with a target of \$213 this year). DG Brian encourages all Rotarians to continue to support the Foundation through clubs and personally as members of the Centurion Club or the Paul Harris Society.

He then expressed appreciation for the wide range of successful programs undertaken by our club over all areas of Rotary service. He also thanked club members currently active in important district roles: Kay Gordon, David Brunt, Brian Foley and Paul Taranto.

Brian then gave background to RI President Tanaka's theme "Peace through Service". Rotary is in the peace building business and provides opportunities to achieve peace and he encourages all clubs to undertake at least one peace related project during the year.

Sue Martin then explained the partners' program to support the Cambodian Children's Program initiated by former Australian actor Scott Neeson. She then showed a short video on the program that cares for some 1500 children in crisis in Cambodia.

Brian Foley proposed the thanks to DG Brian and Sue and presented them with the book "*Mentone through the Years*". President Glenyse then presented Sue with a club donation to the Cambodian Children's Program.
