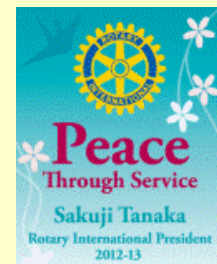

Guest Speaker: Sue Worland "The Red Cross Society"

Sue is the bequest relationship coordinator for Australian Red Cross and is part of the fundraising and marketing team involved with seeking support for the society. Around 20% of the society's income comes from bequests.

Sue gave an outline to the Red Cross, its origins, history and role. The Battle of Solferino 1859 was a decisive and bloody battle in the Italian Wars of Independence. The aftermath was seen by a Swiss Henri Dunant who was appalled by the great loss of life and suffering and set out to do something to improve the situation that lead to establishment of the Red Cross as an independent organisation. Dunant's key ideas were to:

- Establish basic rules of law – the Geneva Conventions or International Humanitarian Law, and
- Establish neutral, impartial relief societies within each country

The International Committee of the Red Cross was founded in 1859 and spread with the set up of societies in many countries. The Australian Red Cross began in 1914.

The familiar Red Cross symbol is taken from the Swiss national flag and had no specific religious connotation although the Red Crescent Society is the corresponding body in Islamic countries.

While Red Cross commenced as a response to war situations, it now operates across three areas, viz.,

- War
- Natural disasters
- General humanitarian relief in most countries.

The Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies have some 13 million volunteers and 3,000 staff worldwide and there are 188 national societies recognised legally by their governments. The society's three symbols are protected by international law.

The priority areas for Red Cross in Australia include emergency response (such as bushfires and floods), international aid and development (70% of natural disasters occur in underdeveloped countries), locational disadvantage, humanitarian law, impacts of immigration, tracing displaced persons, partnering with aboriginals and Torres Strait Islanders in healthy food preparation, social exclusion and the Red Cross Blood Bank

The Object of Rotary

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.
