Reports and Member Announcements

Carol Quayle announced details of the club visit to Fare Share in Abbotsford on 19 November. A member list was circulated seeking names of those who can attend. 16 are needed. Jill Brear commented that she had been involved with Fare Share that acts as a food bank preparing meals for people throughout Melbourne.

Carol announced that the club would assist with the barbeque at the Salvation Army Kingston Gardens centre on Tuesday 3 December.

Carol introduced five staff members of the Mordialloc Sporting Club responsible for preparing the floral table decorations that evening. This is part of a course they are undertaking at Holmesglen TAFE.

Jill Brear (New Generations) reported that the club had two students in the Four-Way-Test speech contest. One candidate, Darren Tate, reached the semi-final but did not progress to the Grand Final.

Sergeant-at-Arms

Acting sergeant for the night was *Keith Carpenter* who is very experienced in this role. Keith had some topical fines related to various sports including the motor cycle Grand Prix, the Caulfield Cup, golf and, of course, football. With the player trade week in progress, our one Sydney supporter and Saints' fans were under scrutiny. Keith also ran a short quiz, without frogs!

Guest speaker – PP Ken Wall – Art Building Children's Dreams (ABCD project)

Ken is a member of the Rotary Club of Templestowe. He explained the background to the ABCD project and how his club initiated within Australia in 2009 following an idea picked up from Canada where it originated.

RC Templestowe commenced the project in Fiji. While it is well known for its popular tourist resorts, Fiji has very many poor areas remote from the major towns and resorts. In 2009, the plight of poor underprivileged children was brought to the club's attention and it was decided to adopt the ABCD approach to encourage children to express their hopes through art and drawing. Ken instanced a local 8 year-old child "Pita" who had been found destitute by a local Rotary club and showed a picture of him drawing for the first time.

The amount of \$250 can support the schooling of a child in Fiji for one year. 200 children have now been sponsored in Fiji and it now includes projects in nine different locations. The program is being extended to other countries including East Timor and Africa where young victims of AIDS affected families are in urgent need of help.

A number of Rotary clubs and other sponsors now support the ABCD program and partnerships are also being developed with Australian schools and Deakin University. In addition to sponsoring the direct schooling costs for students, additional projects are being developed to provide upgraded facilities such as a new kindergarten. Funds donated by Rotary clubs and other donors are forwarded through Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS) and then on to ABCD. Tax deductions are available for individual and corporate sponsors.

At the end of the presentation, the five floral table arrangements were auctioned and this raised \$100 that was donated to the ABCD program.

Don Van proposed the thanks.

The Object of Rotary

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

The Rotary Four-Way-Test

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- Will it build GOODWILL and 3 **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?**
- Will it be BENEFICIAL to all 4 concerned?"
