96 YEARS AGO PRIVATE McDONALD DISAPPEARED INTO THIN AIR, LITERALLY

Many families have stories to tell of great uncles or other relatives who went to war and went missing in 'The war to end all wars'. On 11 November we pause and look back and some of those stories have been handed down to us and remembered and retold to a newer generation.

In my wife's family, a young 16 year old year old lad from northern Victoria, Norman McDonald disappeared without trace. His only memory is his rank and name on the Menin Gate, a memorial to those ANZACs who died in the battle of Passchendaele.

There will be many members of our club who will attend memorial services in Melbourne. In particular at Mentone RSL a strong representative audience of young and old covering many generations will pay their respects to those heroic ANZACs who gave so much.

Carol Quayle (community) reminded her committee of the meeting to be held that night. She also reminded that next week 19 November would be the club visit to Fare Share in Abbotsford replacing the weekly club meeting and asked if anyone else wished to attend.

Jeff Needham than gave an explanation of how Fare Share operates. Food stuffs that are nearly out of date are provided to Fare Share from major supermarkets. It is prepared into meals and cooked by Fare Share volunteers and then distributed to needy people throughout Melbourne by various charity organisations. Around one million meals are prepared each year. The organisation is funded completely privately. 16 volunteers are needed for the visit and they will work from 6.30 to 9.30 pm. Acting sergeant for the night was again *Keith Carpenter*. Keith had a fine for President Len in view of Tottenham Hotspur FC being a winner in English soccer. He even found a (rare) error by the bulletin editor.

Keith also ran the short quiz and Tim and President Len knew some of the answers.

Guest speaker

Chairman Bob Travers introduced guest speaker Senior Sergeant Peter Rowley. Bob explained briefly that he had come to meet Peter as the Rotary representative on the police monitoring program that is aimed at developing firmer links between Victoria Police, the general community and Rotary. Bob has already shown Peter some local community activities involving Rotary.

Peter was stationed at Mordialloc Police Station for five years and is now at Carrum Downs. In 2006 he was selected in a 30 person Victoria Police team serving on a United Nations peace mission in East Timor. There were also police from interstate and other countries.

The UN intervention followed a breakdown in law and order early in 2006 when a massacre and the local police (PNTL) was ineffective and split in factions. Gang and ethnic fighting raged and East Timor risked becoming a failed state. The East Timor government requested international military and police assistance to restore peace. The UN initiative followed a five phase approach aimed at immediate restoration of law and order and the longer term transition of the local police to An effective and professional unit.

Peter undertook various roles including district coordination, Staff Officer, Acting Chief of Operations and Deputy Contingent Commander. He showed us various pictures of conditions and life in East Timor and The nature of problems that were faced in the critical lead up to new elections in June 2007. Apart from the direct policing duties, Peter was involved with escorting visiting dignitaries, including then Prime Minster Howard.

Overall, the mission was a success and the nation has returned to normality. Peter commented how well the UN coordination worked and the high standard of police work among the many nations involved in the mission.
