President David opened the meeting, welcomed members and guests and announced:

Barry Donaldson chaired the reminder of the meeting.

Director and members announcements

Brian Foley (community) reported that he has continued negotiations with Emerge for a new project also with Mia Hall (RC Brighton North) about a possible involvement with the "Busy Feet" program at Sandy Beach Centre.

Brian Schauer (international) reminded of the rescheduled committee meeting to be held that evening.

Jack Cooper gave an update on the Festival of Wheels planning. The City of Kingston has come on board as a sponsor. It is expected that one or more *Tesla* modern electric cars will be displayed.

Jack Pyziakos announced the next Bunnings sausage will be Mon 3 October and took names for the various shifts. Jack also advised that the recent theatre night organised by Kathy at the Shirley Burke centre raised \$115.

Paul Taranto reported on the district youth service seminar he had attended on behalf of the club. Paul also spoke of his negotiations to have Rotary information stands in local shopping centres. He suggested that members could pass RDU magazines to Paul for display to the public. It was also suggested that venues such as doctors' waiting rooms are also useful places to have RDU on display.

Paul also conducted the weekly Rotary Foundation raffle with David Brunt and Brian Schauer winners for the night.

Brian Foley gave a final announcement for the Hellier social gathering held last Sunday.

Sergeant at Arms

Sergeant *Jack Pyziakos* again tested our general knowledge with his quiz dealing with cars (the first was a Daimler Benz in 1886), Fred Flintstone's "car", the Holden "Monaro" and car rallies.

We cheered Don Butler's for his 92nd birthday.

The Storm was to play in the preliminary final last weekend so Jack Pyziakos was happy to be going to see them. Paul told us that the Sandy Dragons won their preliminary final and grandson Tim was pictured in the Leader News taking a "speckie" mark. (News Update: "The Storm" is in the NRL grand final next Sunday. Sandy Dragons won the TAC Cup and Tim Taranto was again among the best players)

Speaker: Richard Tullberg "The History of Woodlands Golf Club"

Richard, a keen golfer himself, is the General Manager of Woodlands Golf Club and has a long association with the club having worked initially on the catering staff as a chef

The land first became available for purchase in the 1870s and was leased to local farmers. In 1913, a school teacher and golfer, George Hunter Rogers, came to the area as head master of Mordialloc Primary School. He first saw the Woodlands site from the nearby Epsom racecourse and recognised its potential to establish a golf course. A committee was formed, the land was purchased and the Mordialloc Golf Club began operation in October 1913 as a nine-hole course. The second nine holes were opened in 1919.

The basic course has changed little over the years, although a 19th hole was added to allow renovations to be made while keeping 18 holes playable.

The original clubhouse was small and replaced by a larger structure in 1922. When this was destroyed by fire, a new building was opened by then Prime Minister Stanley Bruce in 1927. That building remains until this day although it has undergone many additions and renovations, the most recent being a complete overhaul and renovation in 2010.

Richard then listed some of the club's leading players over the years:

Margaret Masters - the first Australian woman professional to play the USA circuit

Ralph Judd and Tony Limon – who Richard described as the best two

Brad Lamb, Steve Allan and Jane Shearwood Two current stars are Nathan Holman who won the 2015 Australian PGA and Julienne Soo a leading female amateur.

Richard also mentioned that Barry Donaldson is a current Honorary Life Member having been a member for over 50 years. Barry responded briefly telling of the rigorous and lengthy process he went through to become a member. Guest Speaker cont.

The club has one other current life member, while 16 are now deceased.

In response to a question, Richard said that the club was renamed "Woodlands" in 1925 to reflect its nature and place in the community. Another question related to the club's relative success in comparison with other local golf clubs. Richard replied that the club endeavoured to maintain good relations with the council and maintained the course and facilities for the benefit of the whole community rather than just golfers.

Jack Cooper proposed the thanks and mentioned that he had been a club member for almost 50 years.


