Sergeant-at-Arms

Sergeant Cliff had some curious fines. Who knew that Cliff's birthday (2/2) is also "groundhog day" in USA – not many of us it seemed. He then spoke about those of us, nearly all, of European heritage, and asked if we still referred to "the old country". He then queried whether Britain is truly the old country when the oldest known skeleton there is some 8,000 years old. By contrast, the oldest known remains found in Australia, "Mungo Man" is estimated to be 50,000+ years old. The Winter Olympics dominated recent sporting coverage and Cliff referred specifically to the extraordinary feats in the cross country and downhill skiing.

Guest Speaker: Olivia Jaconelli "National Youth Science Forum 2018"

Olivia is a Year 12 student at Mentone Girls Secondary College and was sponsored by our Rotary Club to a 12day session of the National Youth Science Forum held in Canberra in January 2018.

NYSF is a 12-day residential activity for students interested in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). Participants gain significant insights into the variety of study and career opportunities available across STEM fields. The program is run by a non-profit organisation that works in partnership with Rotary who sponsor students from throughout Australia. The program is supported by a wide range of academic, public and private organisations from these disciplines.

Olivia participated in a group that concentrated on ecological and environmental studies, including field visits to collect samples of micro-organisms, bringing them to laboratory for examination and then returning them to their habitat. The study also included laboratory testing of coffee making!

The students attended the formal opening in Parliament House, were addressed by many eminent scientists, had opportunities to talk directly with the scientists, met past NYSF students, visited the national science museum and learned a bit about politics. A highlight for Olivia was to sit next to Professor Ian Chubb, former Chief Scientist of Australia and spoke with him.

Olivia thanked the club for providing her a great opportunity to experience many aspects of the STEM subjects and interact directly with those involved. Olivia believes that her probably study course will be in zoology.

Lucy Tsuchida was sponsored by the club to attend the 2017 NYSF and was then invited to attend as a staff member in 2018 (at a different session from Olivia). Lucy commented that she now had an even wider view of NYSF and was convinced to study science.

Both speakers responded to questions and again thanked the club for supporting them. *Brian Foley* proposed the thanks.
