#### Message from President Paul

Hello and welcome everyone to the Changeover night for the Rotary Club of Mordialloc. This is our forty seventh meeting for the 2017-2018 year and this is my last Presidential Message this time around. I am writing this message earlier than normal so I cannot tell how things went in the land of the Giants or if the Demons overcame their demons and returned to the hall of the victors. This message will not be a precis of the annual report rather it will continue to be a reflection on current issues like many of my presidential messages have been.

The last time I was President was back in 2000-2001 and the year was a rather tumultuous one. Not because the world had to deal with the Y2K bug (which turned out to be a bit of a fizzer) but rather because my employer (then called Kemcor) was dealing with a rapidly changing business environment. Much like Telstra is having to do this week (their announcements of job cuts of 8000 was one of the reasons that prompted this reflection). The negotiations with the Unions had gone badly and the unionized workforce was locked out of the plant and I was part of the staff workforce operating the plant. Club meetings were a bit of a rush for me and I would often turn up in my plant gear and share stories of starting up boilers and the like.

However the change that followed that year, organization change, ownership change, re-establishment of working relationships all proved to be productive. The company subsequently had over \$400M reinvested in the business and it still continues to operate today. If you asked me back in 2000/2001 if I thought that would be the case I probably would have said to you it was unlikely.

Recent events in our Club have also prompted us to look at how we go about things and to contemplate change. I would like to thank all members for their constructive engagement in the activities that we have undertaken over the last few weeks and the acknowledgement that change will be necessary to keep the Club relevant and meeting current and future member's needs. The next few months will require the forbearance of members as the meeting cycle is put in place and committee chairs and their committee's find their feet. No doubt adjustments will be necessary but with good will and patience I am sure the Club will be better for it in the months and years ahead.

One theme that was evident in the recent discussions was the desire of members to know more about how Club funds are expended. I recently received a receipt from Wheelchairs for Kids for a donation the Club

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made. I have asked for a copy to be in this bulletin (see p.5). I make the following points:

- The \$1000 the Club donated has made a difference to the lives of 5 individuals who can now get around in a wheelchair as opposed to sitting in one place all day or having to drag themselves across the ground.
- All \$1000 was expended on wheelchairs as all production and administration work is done by volunteers.
- No one is paid for fundraising.

So it is now time to sign off this last President's message. I trust members have found my musings over the weeks to be informative and of interest. I know I have certainly appreciated the opportunity to set aside some time and think about what to say. I hope I continue to do so. Maybe I should start a diary ???

I close off again thanking all Club members for what they have done each day in Making a Difference and I know you will continue to do something each day so that you will Be the Inspiration that continues to show that Rotary is making a difference for the better in our local community, our country and our world.

Members agreed it was important to have a lively Sergeant-at-Arms session at club meetings and a good session included having fines proposed by members from floor as well.

#### Club Forum Feedback

The rest of the meeting was dedicated to feedback from the Club Forum to discuss the future structure of the Rotary Club of Mordialloc.

Following the Forum, a special board meeting was held to review feedback/discussions held. A summary of the feedback was handed out to all members.

President Paul led the discussion and advised there was agreement from all on the following changes to club procedures:

- No Rotary Invocation to be made following the toasts
- No silver bowl on tables for loose change, but there will continue to be a separate collection for Wheelchairs for Kids
- A Perspex display holder will be on the tables, giving a description of the Wheelchairs for Kids project, which raised \$2,700 last year (14 wheelchairs) and the weekly raffle and/or any other current fundraising
- Fines will continue and the Sergeant-at-Arms will explain how the funds raised are used
- Room structure: there will be no head table, all members will be seated at round tables.
   Members will move around the tables each week.

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There will be changes to the 4-week meeting cycle of the club. Weeks will be as follows:

- Week 1: regular club meeting, with a guest speaker
- Week 2: Committee meetings all club members to attend
- Week 3: regular club meeting, with a guest speaker
- Week 4: other Rotary matters/speaker from Rotary, followed by a Board meeting

In the case of there being a Week 5 in the month:

 A visit to a local restaurant – to be organised by someone other than the Program Director

It was also suggested that "Friends of Rotary" nights be held, possibly 2 meetings per year.

The committee structure was reviewed and it was agreed that the committees will be:

- International
- Youth
- Projects and Fundraising
- Community
- Membership and Marketing

It was noted that the committee structure will only work if members actively participate. Directors of Committees are to be appointed and in Week 2 of the meeting cycle, all members will attend the meeting and be part of a committee.

#### Meeting Protocol:

- Members are asked to stand whenever addressing the meeting
- More information to go in the Bulletin regarding projects, committee decisions and a brief treasurer's report.

Other matters raised were:

- Sickness all should be mindful of giving too much information and invading people's privacy.
- Members are reminded to be mindful of religious or political bias
- Make-ups: to be renamed 'Rotary Attendances'
- · Funding for projects to be reviewed

It was decided that all the above be reviewed again in 6 months' time, when any new ideas could be presented.
