This project is multi-purposed and supplies water and facilities to support local farmers producing food and also to provide water and sanitation for a school and village.

Fr Jason and Wilma spoke to a PowerPoint presentation and a short video showing the progress of the project over 10 years. This covers the availability of cows and goats to provide milk, growth of bananas, maize and other vegetables and the subsequent great improvements in health for student and the local community.

They also showed another video for their next major project which is the purchase of a large tractor to improve productivity and expand the areas of cultivated crops. They are submitting an application for a Rotary Global Grant to assist purchase of this equipment.

Both Fr Jason and Wilma expressed thanks to District 9810, RC Healesville and other clubs and individuals who have contributed through grants to this development. Our club contributed to the milking goat project several years ago.
