Reports and Members' Announcements

Secretary *Trina* had received two offers from people offering to sew for the End Trachoma project. There has also been a membership enquiry passed to Kay. A board meeting would be held this Monday.

Paul said that he, David, Phil and Graeme would attend the Parkdale United Cricket Club that Thursday to present the Keith Carpenter Memorial Award to a young cricketer *Kay* reported that a total amount of \$1163 had been donated to date for the Parkinsons Walk appeal. Some money is still outstanding; Thanks to everyone.

Kathy referred to the resumption of Bunnings sausage sizzles and our club has been allocated Saturday 12 December. Some members offered to help.

Members then moved to rooms for the Community and Projects committee meetings. Reports from these meetings are summarised below.

Community:

The End Trachoma hygiene packs and the development of a sensory garden at the Emerge refuge are the main projects at present. Sewing of bags for hygiene kits is going well. DG Alma has commented favourably on our efforts for End Trachoma

Planning for the Emerge sensory garden project is continuing. Placement of the planned mural should be decided this week. The Mordialloc Men's Shed will construct some timber seats for the garden and the question of paying them needs resolution. If the project continues in 2021, it is possible that a District Grant could be available

The food parcels project is completed. Some 230 packs were distributed.

Still in discussion with Woodlands GC on resumption of club meetings. Should be clearer now after easing of restrictions. No date yet for club Christmas function, it might become clearer this week. The lunch for lonely people is cancelled for this year.

Projects:

Bunnings sausage sizzles are resuming and we have one booked for 12 December. There is a list of strict instructions, including clean clothes and aprons, to meet Covid requirements. Jack and Phil will attend the first Bunnings BBQ to see how it goes. It is also suggested that we write to the District Governor suggesting a nationwide increase in prices of sausages and drinks set by Bunnings.

A community social gathering on Australian Day is being considered. A display publicising the Centenary of Rotary in Australia is proposed at the Gnome and Fairy Festival.

Other Matters

Jack Cooper won the fortnightly raffle and earned a voucher for Bocconcino's pizzeria.

Jack also reported that George Aivatoglou is still not well. However, Jill reported that Len Brear is recovering well.

Phil has negotiated via local member Tim Richardson and obtained agreement of the transport authorities for erection of club signage at Mentone, Parkdale, Mordialloc and Aspendale railway stations.
