This endeavour eventually led to the application of pacemakers that keep many people alive today. Another Australian tested the use of lithium as a treatment to help people suffering from bipolar disorder. Today lithium treatment helps many people modulate their brain activity and lead stable lives. In recent times Dr Fiona Wood saw that there was a need for a better faster treatment for burns victims. Her work led to the development of a spray on skin treatment that has shortened the treatment time by many weeks.

Rotary is well versed in seeing needs and then doing something about addressing them. The "EndPolio Now" campaign is a great example of how Rotary has seen a need and has then harnessed the advantages of an International organisation to drive the effort to eradicate the world of this scourge.

In the months ahead the Rotary clubs in NSW will no doubt become aware of needs in their communities that are not being met through local state and federal government efforts. When the time comes, I am sure ours and other Rotary clubs will look to support the NSW clubs as they work to fill gaps as their communities rebuild.

This week's message has been about responding to needs so this week's saying is appropriately about our role in responding to needs. It comes from the American author Marianne Williamson.
