## President's message 20 July 2021

What a difference a week makes. A week ago we were looking forward to holding a face-to-face meeting this coming week and three club events were planned for later in the week. Now we are back in lockdown, the Reclink sports day at Port Melbourne has been rescheduled again and, as I prepare this message on Saturday, the latest information suggests that the lockdown might be extended further. We certainly hope that the dangerous Delta version of Covid-19 is contained quickly so that a semblance of normal life can return. Whether our forthcoming Bunnings sausage sizzle and first involvement in the Mordialloc Saturday market can proceed will be resolved early this week.

At last week's meeting, I mentioned some matters reported at the recent District 9810 changeover night. In the 2020-21 Rotary year, despite the severe Covid lockdown restrictions in District 9810, the longest and most severe lockdown of any district in the region, D9810 was the most successful in a range of RI performance indicators in nearly all areas of service. We can all take pride in this. As well, Mordialloc was one of only three clubs to receive the RI certificate for outstanding service in three major areas of service, viz, *projects, club building and communication and public relations*.

Last Tuesday the community, international and projects committees all met and discussed their planning for 2021-22. We have an ambitious program continuing many existing activities and partnerships and planning some new ones. In the last few days we have paid \$5000 to the RAWCS storm damage appeal for the Dandenong Ranges and \$2000 for our continuing support of Fareshare.

Following discussions with members earlier in the month, the membership of various club committees and other positions has been finalised for the year and is shown in an attachment to this bulletin.

The club bulletin is now being prepared by a small committee of Trina, Jenny Pudney and me. We have decided that it will now be compiled and distributed twice per month, generally early in the first and third weeks of the month. The bulletin contents should remain the same as in the past although some

improvements are expected to be introduced to improve bulletin preparation and presentation.

I finish with a quotation on the subject of change by Irish dramatist and writer George Bernard Shaw that was written a century ago but is still relevant to our times:

*"Progress is impossible without change; and those who cannot change their minds cannot change anything."*

NYSF has been a solid source of young people who have gone on to be involved with Rotary in our district.

Yarrabah School (Aspendale) breakfast club – Di and Trina are visiting to meet coordinator, Kim on Wednesday, and will be volunteering on Tuesday and Friday mornings. Anyone else is also welcome to volunteer their time.

Ernie (Projects) reported that Barry Donaldson has stepped down as organiser of the Interplast Golf Day. All recognised and applauded the fabulous job that Barry has done over a long period of time. The new Golf Day Committee is Jack Cooper, Cliff Riley, Barry Donaldson, Ernie Williams and Trevor Salmon. Some of the raffle prizes being held for the Gnome & Fairy Festival will be used at the golf day in September.

**President's Announcements:**

President Brian opened the meeting and welcomed all present. He then announced the following:

The District 9810 changeover was held last Friday with approximately 200 present. Everyone, especially outgoing DG Alma, was glad to be able to hold it in person. Mordialloc attendees were Jack and Glenyse, Paul, Helen and Brian. It was a successful year for District 9810. The District was described by past RI President Ian Riseley as "*the little district that could.*" Despite the severe Covid lockdown restrictions in our District 9810, the longest and most severe lockdown of any district across the region, D9810 was the most successful over a range of RI performance indicators in nearly all areas of service. We were one of only three clubs to receive RI certificate for outstanding service in three major areas of service, viz, projects, club building and communication and public relations.

Proposed amalgamation of Districts 9810 and 9820 (Gippsland) due to take effect 1 July 2024 was also mentioned by Incoming DG Daryl Moran and PRIP Ian Riseley. The coming year will be the first time in 25 years that Brian has not had an official role at District level.
