## **President's message**

Welcome to our first club meeting for 2022. I trust that you and your families had an enjoyable break with family and friends over the Christmas and New Year period.

Last Tuesday we were able to hold our traditional social croquet evening at Sandringham Croquet Club. The weather was very pleasant, the lawns and surroundings were in good condition and the adults and one child enjoyed themselves. Jennifer Cloke's granddaughter, Charlotte, showed us how well she could hit a croquet ball when I found her a mallet with a short handle.

The ongoing Covid 19 pandemic is getting more complicated with each day. A few weeks ago it seemed that with high levels of vaccination across the nation, the dangerous Delta version had reached its peak and after nearly two years the country was finally opening up. Then the highly transmissible Omicron version appeared and has spread rapidly causing daily case numbers and hospital admissions to soar to levels unheard of a couple of months ago. Obviously we are going to be living with a range of restrictions for a long while yet.

During the week, I received a letter from Rotary International President Shekhar Mehta setting out Rotary's position in relation to Covid-19 vaccination. Some key points are:

- Rotary endorses and encourages vaccination for all individuals and members
- Misinformation has become an "infodemic" that hinders the fight against COVID-19
- Globally, Rotary is actively engaged in assuring equity in vaccine access to all people.
- Rotary salutes health care workers everywhere as they continue to provide lifesaving services.
- Rotary and Rotaract clubs are encouraged to be exemplary role models and redouble efforts to support Covid-19 treatment, prevention and vaccination.

I have asked Secretary Trina to copy the full text of the RI President's letter to all members.

About a week ago I received news that a former member and president of Rotary Club of Mordialloc, Peter Cleal, had died after a long illness. Peter was club president in 1984-85. He then moved to live and work in New Zealand and returned to Australia after retirement to live in Woodend where he died. I only met Peter a few times although I knew other members of the Cleal family. I spoke with Peter's sister Trish last week and expressed condolences to the family on behalf of the club.

As we look forward to navigating our way through 2022, I leave you with the following inspirational quotation from writer and author Robert Louis Stevenson:
