Gnome & Fairy Festival Presentation

On 15 March, Jack Cooper, Trina and Ernie talked to everyone about the organisation and preparation for the Gnome & Fairy Festival on Sunday 20 March. Di spoke about the volunteers and roles for the day and presented a draft roster.

Guest Speakers on 22 March

Peter and Helene Brown The Dreketi School Project

Peter and Helene Brown were members of the Rotary Club of Chelsea for several years. After visiting Fiji and becoming involved in projects there, they eventually moved there 7 years ago.

Peter's 60 years experience as a carpenter by trade and builder by profession has been put to good use working on a number of projects. They are involved with a very active club, the Rotary Club of Taveuni Island and Helene has been Secretary of the club for over 6 years. Taveuni is close to Gamea Island, the location of the Dreketi School, which is to be rebuilt with money which includes a donation from our club.

Peter was able to tell us about the cyclone-rated building materials which have already been successfully used to rebuild after the damage done by the 2016 cyclone Winston. Lots of schools have been destroyed in recent years, but the government can't rebuild them all and the Dreketi school hasn't been allocated any government funds.

The total amount needed to rebuild the school is \$225,000 Fiji dollars. Many local people work at the Red Bull Resort and they have donated FJ\$100,000. RC Taveuni has raised FJ\$40,000 and FJ\$7,500 each has been donated by RC Frankston Peninsula and RC Mordialloc.

The RC Taveuni is also involved in a cataract program involving a medical team from all parts of the world.

Les Marton The History of the Concorde

Les Marton is a Rotarian with the Rotary Club of Box Hill Burwood. He is a retired airline Captain who has flown both private and commercial planes. He is very knowledgeable about the Concorde and gave an interesting presentation on the history and technology of the plane. Concorde is a supersonic airliner with a maximum speed over twice the speed of sound. Les describes the Concorde as "a fighter plane carrying 100 people".

Concorde was designed when there were no computers and models were built in full size. The English designers needed a partner and the French came on board with production taking place in Toulouse. Twenty aircraft were built, and Air France and British Airways were the only airlines to purchase them. Designed to reach the speed of sound, the Concorde flew at 1300 miles per hour. Flights started in 1969, with the first commercial flight on 21 January 1976.

Les showed us some interesting photos and a video of the inside of the cockpit, a very small space compared to today's aircraft.

The Concorde had one fatal accident in 27 years of service in which 105 people died. Following that crash, a scare campaign resulted in falling numbers and, combined with high maintenance costs, the last flights were in 2003.

Some places were Concordes can be viewed are at the Air and Space Museum at Le Bourget Airport, France; the Air Museum in Somerset, UK, the Delta Museum at Orly Airport, Paris and Heathrow Airport, London.

Paul gave a vote of thanks to our speakers.
