Particularly on a Tuesday at Dingley. When COVID stopped some of the activities she found extra work at the local op shop. I remember on one occasion she said to me: "I don't wish for less problems, I wish for more skills. Don't wish for less challenges, wish for more wisdom"

Farewell to my friend's mother. Thank you to her daughter for her continual reminder of the goals of Rotary. Thank you for the reminder of the Four Way Test. Is it the truth, is it fair to all concerned. These are questions we must continually ask ourselves and answer them honestly.

As Rotarians we will never know the value that is given to our programs. Our work in schools, our support to projects, our sponsorship of children through The Smith Family, our continual support of people through food donations at The Salvos, or our continued support of the Parkinsons Group as well as other community projects. What we do know is that we are following the Four Way test, and we know that what we do is beneficial to all concerned.

Report from Board meeting on 21 January

Main discussion points and motions from this meeting were:

- What is special about Mordialloc Mentone Rotary? We have had a very impressive number of activities, particularly in the months leading up to Christmas.
- Trina Williams was appointed "Public Officer", a requirement of the ATO that someone assume this named position in order to authorise change of name to the Rotary Club of Mordialloc Mentone Inc.
- Financial report accepted, with total funds of \$44,009.40.
- Community:
 - Jenny Pudney presented a comprehensive report on the Safe Sleeping project progress and outcomes. The Board moved a vote of thanks to Jennifer Cloke and Jenny Pudney for all the exceptional work they have done to bring about the success of the project.
 - The Board acknowledged the following financial contributions made to the project, in addition to those made by RC Mordialloc Mentone:
 Bendigo Bank, Parkdale: \$8,000; Lions Club, Mordialloc: \$5,000; RC Chelsea:
 \$1,000; RC Dingley Noble Park: \$3,000; RC Oakleigh Clayton Huntingdale: \$5,000.
- International:
 - A donation to Interplast following the Golf Day will be proposed for the next board meeting.

- Youth:
 - NYSF has finished and students will be invited to speak.
 - The Board moved a motion to spend \$600 to provide morning tea for teachers at local high schools.
- Projects:
 - Bunnings BBQs are confirmed for the 3rd Friday of each month through 2025; the Mentone Market is back on Sunday, 2nd February. Club money spinner and recycling of bottles and cans continue to bring in steady income.
- Other business:
 - The Club approved a donation of up to \$1,000 to support the local Mordialloc Weavers who have a project to weave with the Yongu people in East Arnhem land and connect Mordialloc with this community. Jenny Pudney is to follow up with the weavers.
