GUEST SPEAKER -

Daniel Ward CASE MANAGER COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS PROGRAM at Kingston Council.

- Daniel works in the Community Connections subgroup of Access Care in the Kingston Council.
- Kingston Council is the only council that does this.
- Daniel and one other cover Kingston & Bayside
- Case Managers for the homeless or those at risk of homeless. Hoarding is a big issue.
- The Salvos Christmas lunch for people who live alone use Access Care for connections.
- There are 3 types of Homeless:
 - o Primary Those sleeping rough
 - Secondary Those in refuges or couch surfing

- Tertiary Have accommodation but it is below minimum standards
- How does homeless happen?
 - Financial difficulties (46%)
 - o Family and domestic violence (44%)
 - Housing crisis (34%)
- Homelessness in Kingston based on the 2021 census 544 were counted as homeless an increase of 23% since 2016. The 544 where composed of:
 - o 3 rough sleepers
 - o 212 homeless accommodation
 - o 54 family
 - o 100 rooming houses
 - o 47 hotels etc
 - o 130 over crowded dwellings
- How to approach someone who is sleeping rough:
 - o Their level
 - o Don't assume you know what they need
 - Respect boundaries
 - Be forgiving
 - Don't be sorry
 - o Know your limits
 - o Reflect on your learnings

Questions:

- There are a lot of assistance options in the Service Sector
- The numbers are probably greater than 4 years ago estimate 2000
- The numbers are fluid with people moving into and out of the homeless pool
- Daniel is the best pathway for the Salvos to house people
- How to reduce the number? More wraparound services are needed. It won't be fixed by providing housing alone (may end up a ghetto). There is a huge wait list for housing. You need all the services such as rehab/detox etc before placing into housing. It is a community of people without life skills.
- Hoarders a lot result from childhood abuse.

- End Polio coordinator NZ and Australia
- Australian has paid a very important role
- Rotary's number 1 global project
- · Fundraising, raising awareness and advocacy
- Still cases around the world
- What is Poliomyelitis viral, spread by faeces, can affect, brain, spine, limbs
- Ancient disease
- Sir Frank MacFarlane Burnet made significant discoveries
- Sister Elizabeth Kenny developed radically new and controversial method of treating children with polio
- Alan Marshall wrote "I Can Jump Puddles"
- Jane Middleton spent 60 years in an iron lung
- 1955 Jonas Salk developed polio vaccine
- 1966 Sabin Oral Vaccine introduced in Australia
- 1972 last case of polio in Australia
- 1988 Global Polio Eradication Initiative formed
- 98 cases in the world in 2024 mainly Afghanistan and Pakistan lots of challenges within those countries
- US \$50 million per year Rotary contribution Bill Gates to match that amount
- Actions for our club Polio presentation each year, make a contribution of \$1500, personal contribution engage in World Polio Day activities

 people had been vaccinated overseas – 96% of Australians vaccinated – friend contracted polio, died at 23, very serious thing in those early days


