NOTES FROM ROTARY ZOOM COMMITTEE MEETING #2515 MAY 27, 2025

President David welcomed all members and guests and spoke about the appeal for donations to provide emergency relief for flood affected areas in NSW.

Jack Cooper chaired the meeting and introduced District Governor, Colin Byron. Colin spoke about:

- Merging of 2 districts to form District 9815, which brought together 76 Rotary clubs,
 4 Rotaract clubs and 24 Interact clubs which is more than anywhere else in Australia.
- With a loss of 20% of Rotarians in our area in last 5 years, this year's focus has been on growing membership and changing how Rotary clubs operate
- Our Zone has grown by 250 members and half the clubs in the district are growing.
- Important to look at alternatives to dinner-based clubs and Satellite clubs offer a different way of contributing.
- Satellite clubs are often "cause-based" clubs ie Traralgon Central has 10 new members who meet once a month and work for the "Days for Girls" cause. Another satellite club brings together people who live in a lifestyle village for cause-based work.

Colin presented our club with 2 awards:

- 1. From the Rotary Foundation in recognition of the Club's financial support for End Polio Now
- 2. Club Annual Donor for support of the Rotary Foundation

Club reports:

Secretary -Trina drew attention to the changes from 1st July to Rotary Down Under (email sent to all members). Also presented drafts of the new club banner with suggested changes for everyone's approval.

Treasurer - Brian gave details of accounts, which are all in good shape.

Community -

- David said Parkinson's group is going well and next meeting is 12 June
- Heart health group will be back in September
- Thanks to Trevor, Wendy and Paul for the completion of the shed and ramp for the Dingley Gardens
- Food donations are still welcome at the Salvos

Youth – no report in Di's absence, but everyone told DG Colin about the great connections Di has created with local schools, and the programs we have supported students to participate in.

Projects -

- the Parkdale grand opening was a great success and the raffle raised \$246. Thanks to everyone who participated on the day, and to Di and Paul for setting up the event.


